## Aphrodite's Tree1 - Species Communication Station

A legend from the coast of Asia Minor tells that the goddess Aphrodite had her favorite place under a Monk's Pepper Tree. To this day, this tree is considered a sacred site.

By decision of the sixth Organisms Parliament, a communication station for the species Monk's Pepper (Aphrodite's Tree) and humans is established on the premises of Organisms Democracy Berlin Osloer Straße.

Visitors book 20-minute slots for a protected sleeping station. They then have a one-on-one introductory conversation in Turkish, German or English about Monk's Pepper and ways of communicating with plants as described by Robin Wall Kimmerer in "Braiding Sweetgrass". Then they climb up a ladder to the top of our container where we have installed a bed in which you can lie with your head directly under a plant of Monk's Pepper. Here you are completely on your own and can try to enter into communication with the Monk's Pepper for 20 minutes.


